Universität Hamburg invites applications for 3 Research Associates in accordance with Section 28 subsection 3 of the Hamburg Higher Education Act (Hamburgisches Hochschulgesetz, HmbHG). The position commences on Oct. 1<sup>st</sup> 2018 .

It is remunerated at the salary level of the Horizon 2020 MSCA ITN lump sum for early stage researchers and calls for 100 % of standard work hours per week\*.

The fixed-term nature of this contract is based upon Section 2 of the Academic Fixed-Term Labor Contract Act (Wissenschaftszeitvertragsgesetz, WissZeitVG). The term is fixed for a period of 3 years.

The University aims to increase the number of women in research and teaching and explicitly encourages qualified women to apply. Equally qualified female applicants will receive preference in accordance with the Hamburg Equality Act (Hamburgisches Gleichstellungsgesetz, HmbGleiG).

### **Responsibilities:**

Duties primarily include research for the individual PhD project in the framework of the Horizon 2020 Innovative Training Network “ Participatory Memory Practices. Concepts, strategies, and media infrastructures for envisioning socially inclusive potential futures of European Societies through culture” (POEM), participation in the PhD training programme, and the dissemination activities of the POEM research outcome.
